I started by creating an account on LibraryThing and it took me to my empty catalog. Then I clicked add books at the top menu bar. I searched for various titles and selected the editions I wanted to use in my library. Under, your books, was my new catalog of the books I had just chosen. I visited the page for each title and the top tags were listed under the tags bar. I then went back to my books and double clicked to edit tags and typed in the top tags for each book, author, genre.

LibraryThing is a social cataloging website because it allows users to pick their own tags for their books and connect to other books that are similar or other users that have added those same books or tags. Users can describe the resource based on what they think is most accurate and this is the uncontrolled and democratic feature of tagging. By showing the top tags on the books title page, LibraryThing is allowing users to connect and be influenced by the tags that have already been chosen. Instead of having a professional, controlled vocabulary, books can have tags that are new and it can immediately grow. LibraryThing shows the tag frequency by the size of the tag so that users can see what is most frequently used and best described the item.
